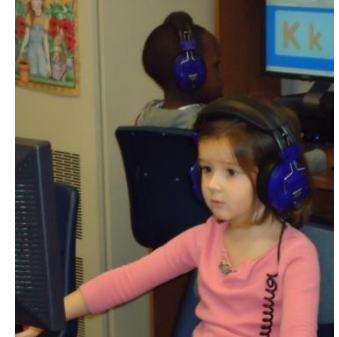

LCS Foundation 2010-11 Recap Rejoicing in God's Faithfulness


Our God is an awesome God! We are celebrating another year of God's provision – many times in ways we could not have asked or imagined.

- Contributions of more than one million dollars were received this year, enabling us to strengthen our academic offerings, improve our facilities, increase teachers' salaries and expand outreach programs.
- The LCSF Endowment for the Future was established and invested with Barnabas Foundation. This fund allows us to invest in the next generation of LCS students.
- One hundred and twenty students received nearly \$200,000 in scholarships thanks to the generosity of many LCS supporters through direct contributions and participation in the Black & Gold Celebration.
- The LCS community provided their time and talent to upgrade our sports fields, maintain the building, welcome new families, celebrate our community, mentor students, assist teachers, and much more.
- Tuition increases were kept to a minimum thanks to tax deductible contributions that covered ~20% of 2010-11 expenses.
- Many families received multi-child grants made possible by contributions from other school families, grandparents, alumni and alumni parents.
- The outdoor secondary sports fields were expanded and developed by an incredible group of volunteers who donated time, talent, materials and the finances needed to host district and regional events.
- Hidden Treasures donated \$30,000 to LCS for teaching staff bonuses. HT was able to purchase their building thanks to donors that contributed to the down payment. By owning their building HT was able to reduce their tax burden and monthly payments.
- The lot and house on the corner of Belle Chase & Pinetree was donated to the school, making way for future development.
- The Bowden Endowment for Faculty Spiritual Enrichment was established through a generous estate gift. Several other Legacy Circle gifts, from friends who included LCS in their estate planning, were received.
